Mesh Systems by Cambridge Architectural Offer Form, Function and Economy

CAMBRIDGE, MD... Mesh systems by Cambridge Architectural offer form, function and economy, all in one design, allowing creative architecture responsive to architect's imaginations.

Cambridge Architectural system applications include Façades, Space Sculpting, Corporate Branding, Security and Safety, Solar, Ventilation and Landscape Interiors.

The elements of a Cambridge system include the desired application, the attachment hardware and the metal fabric.

To ensure specification of the right system – appropriate for a specific application and design vision – they are specified by first determining which system best defines the application. An attachment method is selected next to choose how the metal fabric is installed and its installed appearance, and finally the metal fabric pattern is chosen.

Cambridge Architectural offers ten standard attachments for metal fabrics, each providing a unique installed aesthetic. Five attachments are tensioned – holding the metal fabric in tension across an expanse. Four of these utilize rigid frames and one attaches metal fabric like a traditional curtain.

Each metal fabric pattern has a distinct look. Some patterns are flexible in two directions, some in only one direction and some are entirely rigid. Several patterns are closed weaves, while others feature a percentage of open area.

"Architectural mesh systems provide solutions for aesthetic and functional design obstacles," says Kevin Mayer, director of business development and marketing for Cambridge Architectural. "The ease of combining aesthetics and functionality make architectural mesh systems uniquely attractive to architects and designers."

Cambridge identifies their mesh systems according to key functions. A Façade system visually differentiates a building exterior while a Space Sculpting system defines space within open interior or exterior areas. Corporate Branding systems are a perfect vehicle for presenting and showcasing corporate identity. The primary function of Security & Safety systems is to provide aesthetically pleasing methods of protection for people and property such as fall protection, security, wind abatement and blast mitigation. Solar systems shade sun and reduce light pollution and Ventilation systems facilitate airflow. Landscape Interior systems broadly feature metal fabric within an expansive interior.
